Lily of the Mohawks

On 21 October 2012, our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, canonized **Saint Kateri Tekakwitha**, also known as **Lily of the Mohawks**, at Saint Peter's Basilica in the Vatican. The first Native American to become a Roman Catholic saint, she was born a Mohawk in present-day New York in 1656 and died in 1680. When she was a child, almost all of her village was wiped out by smallpox orphaning her, leaving scars on her face and impairing her eyesight. At age eighteen, Kateri met the Jesuit Father Jacques de Lamberville who came to her village. She became very interested in Catholic faith, started studying the catechism and was baptised at age 20. Since her tribe strongly opposed to her becoming a Catholic, Kateri moved to the Jesuit mission of Kahnawake in what is today Canada. She professed a vow of virginity and lived a life of chastity until her death. She was beatified by Blessed Pope John Paul II in 1980. Various miracles and supernatural events are attributed to her name after her death. The last wonderful healing happened in 2006. Jake Finkbonner, a then 6-year-old of Washington was infested by streptococcus bacteria due to a minor injury on his lips. His condition deteriorated dramatically and his doctors gave up any hope. At this stage, his parents prayed to Kateri because she also suffered from scars on her face and Jake was also of Native American origin. One day a member of the "Society of the Blessed Kateri" brought a relic of Kateri to Jake's pillow. Next day Jake's illness made a turn and he recovered soon after.
