THE FAITH OF TONY BLAIR

Tony Blair led "New Labor" to a landslide victory in 1997 and was Britain's Prime Minister for 10 years. His parents were not churchgoers and he "rediscovered" his Christianity while a student at Oxford in the 1970s and was received into the Church of England at that time.

His faith took on an extra dimension when he met and married Cherie Booth, a young lawyer, after graduating. She is a devout Catholic; not a posh Catholic, but a Liverpool-Irish, working class, convent-educated girl with cousins who became priests. She and Blair would spend hours talking about God and what we were here for. It is fair to say that it was religion that brought them together.

Their four children have been brought up as Catholics, and Blair has worshiped at Catholic churches for more than 20 years. Though Britain is a secular society, it is a Protestant nation with an established Protestant Church.

So it was not until Blair left office that his long spiritual journey reached a destination and he was received into the Catholic Church. Says Blair: Faith is part of our future, and faith and the values it brings with it are an essential part of making globalization work.

Blair enjoys being part of a worldwide community with shared values, traditions and rituals.

In 2008 he unveiled the *Tony Blair Faith Foundation* dedicated to collaboration among those of different religious faiths to help address some of the world's most pressing social problems (http://www.tonyblairfaithfoundation.org/). Long before there were multinational companies or organizations like the U.N., there were communities of faith with a global reach, whose adherents moved from one end of the earth to the other, saving souls.

Blair's first target is malaria, which kills 850,000 children each year, many of whom could be saved by prophylactic bedding. In this and other projects he hopes to unite efforts of Christianity, Judaism, Islam, Buddhism, Hindus and Sikhs. Blair's respect in which he holds other pilgrims enables him to see that beliefs other than his can contribute to mutual goals.
