Nehemiah 8:2-6, 8-10 ● Psalm 19:8-10, 15 ● 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 ● Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

You may think it rather strange to speak about "when the Bible was born." Generally, people don't think much about how the Bible came to be. They seem just to assume that God delivered it to man, so that man would immediately recognize it as God's word. Then all he would have to do is to read it, and find the right way to live and to save his soul.

From outward appearances, there is nothing about the Bible that could not have been produced by man alone. It is a completely human work, so far as it appears to man. And yet, God has made known the fact that He Himself is the principal and responsible author of the Bible. He simply used the mind, the will and the hand of man to "write" the Bible, as a human being uses an instrument, such as a pen.

God used man to write the book because man added something to God's expression of His thought. What he added was what other men needed to have in order to follow the thoughts of God. For God does not think as man does – step by step from facts to conclusions, from conclusions to application. In God, there is one simple, brilliant, eternal act of knowledge that knows in one simple instant all that God is and all that God will ever do. In God, there is neither increase in knowledge, nor lapse of memory.

This is not the kind of knowledge that God can transmit directly to man; man simply cannot grasp this. Therefore, God used various "pens" to write the Bible. He used different human instruments for the purpose He had in mind. The humans each had distinct characteristics and ways of speaking and what God is saying through each of them is always brought back to one supreme truth – God is our savior, saving us from ourselves and our fallen tendencies; that God has freed us to live with Him now and always.
