February 21, 2010 First Sunday of Lent • Year C

Deuteronomy 26:4-10 • Psalm 91:1-2, 10-15 • Romans 10:8-13 • Luke 4:1-13

If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written: "He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you..." Luke 4:9-10

Was God compelled to give us freedom? No, but in doing so he made it possible for us to exercise our own responsibility in acknowledging our dependence on Him. In giving us responsibility, He also gave us the ability to abuse this gift and to deny the order of creation. He created plant life and gave it governing principles which we, through observation, call the laws of nature. He created the animal life but gave it only the faculty of instinct. Mankind He created with freedom. Animals and plants continue to exist according to their laws, offering mute testimony to the Intelligence that made them. With us, it is different. We can bring ourselves into harmony with the laws God has made for us, or we can be discordant notes, if we choose. And, in direct proportion, we must take the consequences. For life is not an end to itself. It is a purpose. Only as we perceive and strive toward that purpose, do we live rightly.

True religion cannot make anyone smug or self-satisfied. Merely because a man knows the purpose of life and is trying to follow it, does not of itself guarantee him a place among the immortals. But it does at least give him the basis to begin living. The possession of religion will not of itself guarantee that all life's problems will be solved, but it will give one the basic principles without which no solution will be possible.

One might ask why God allows there to be pain and suffering. God is not simply a larger version of ourselves, with passions and imperfections. He has created all things for eternity, not for the moment. He has not been taken by surprise by the actions of the creatures. He knew these and all their consequences at the beginning of His divine plan. He made allowances for them. Pain and suffering are not utterly evil things, but the possible means of great spiritual good, when used in accordance with God's plan.

In short, religion does not give us a prepared blueprint for each one of life's problems. It does not supply us with pat answers for everything we encounter in life. It does tell us that there are answers to be found and how to make a blueprint for our lives. Religion gives us a place to begin.
