Westminster Cathedral – 100 years old

One of the most important places of worship in the Catholic Church of England and Wales, the Westminster Cathedral was consecrated a hundred years ago in 1910. After the Catholic Church's hierarchy was restored in the 19th century, the construction of Westminster Cathedral in London (not to be confused with Westminster Abbey) started in 1895 under Cardinal Vaughan and was designed by John Francis Bentley. The cathedral opened in 1903 and was the third Catholic place of worship built in Britain after the English Reformation. Under the laws of the Catholic Church at the time, no place of worship could be consecrated unless free from debt, so the consecration ceremony took place on June 28, 1910. In 1977, as part of her Silver Jubilee Celebrations, the cathedral was visited by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. This was a visit not to a religious service, nevertheless it was highly symbolic as the first visit of a reigning monarch of the United Kingdom and the Head of the Church of England to a Catholic church in the UK since the Reformation. On May 28, 1982, the first day of his six-day visit to the United Kingdom, Pope John Paul II celebrated Mass in the Cathedral. In 1995, Queen Elizabeth visited the cathedral again, this time at a Catholic church liturgy. On September 18, 2010, on his four-day visit to the United Kingdom, our Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI celebrated Mass in the Cathedral. Westminster Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Westminster, which is one of the 22 dioceses of the five-million-member-strong Catholic Church in England and Wales, as well as center of one of its five Provinces.
