Jesus is born into a world of violence and suffering

When we celebrate Advent, do we simply wait for the birth of a baby, a special baby? I hope this is not all we do! There must be more because we know that as a grown-up this baby had to suffer, was killed and – this is what we believe – rose from the dead. He came into a world where massacres like the one in Newtown/Connecticut (Dec 14th 2012) take place – a world of suffering and violence.

We know the whole life and message of this baby who is to become Jesus the Christ. We know his message that was about freeing people, setting people free. In the Old Testament, God leads his people out from Egypt; the exodus gives the people a new homeland, new hope, new future. In the New Testament, Jesus sets us free by his resurrection, he sets us free from sin and brings new life, assures us of the love of God.

This is why John's comment about Jesus is so important: "...One mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." In other words: "The one I'm preceding will be even more emphatic than I am on how you are to relate to one another. There is no other way he can lead you to freedom."

Fortunately, we hear these biblical words in the context of the Lord's Supper, of our Sunday Eucharist here at All Saints, the action which makes us one. The Eucharist builds our community. Look around as these words are being proclaimed, glance at those with whom you share responsible ties, those who guarantee us the freedom Jesus has won for us – and let us not forget the victims and families in Newtown: they are also part of our community of humankind and we are responsible to act in such a way that, in the future, God does not have to suffer together with us as much as we and He suffer now.
