Rainer Maria Cardinal Woelki's Lenten Letter (Excerpts)

In 304 the Roman Emperor Diocletian prohibited the Christians, under capital punishment, to meet on Sundays for the celebration of the Eucharist. In Abitene, today Tunisia, 49 Christians had nevertheless assembled for the Eucharist when they were caught by the police. One of them, Emeritus, said to Proconsul Anulinus: "Without Sunday we can't." He meant we cannot live without gathering on a Sunday to celebrate the Eucharist. The 49 Abitene martyrs were cruelly tortured and killed. By shedding their blood they professed their faith."

We have no need to look that far into the past, since also here in our archdiocese, under two totalitarian and godless governments, Christians were ready to suffer oppression and sometimes sacrifice their lives for their faith. Soon we will celebrate the 50th anniversary of the consecration of Maria Regina Martyrum, the memorial church of the victims of the Nazi regime.

Which place do we give to the Eucharist in our lives? There are several good reasons for this examination: the Year of Faith proclaimed by the Holy Father, the impending national Eucharistic Congress, and, in our archdiocese, the pastoral reflection how to create room for the Faith in the future. I thank God that in our country we do at present not suffer persecution and no totalitarian system forces us to risk 'the whole lot' for celebrating the Eucharist.

But even though our situation is quite different, it is not necessarily easier than in former days. Our problem is that we live in a largely secularized world which simply allows no place for God. Are 60 minutes too much in comparison to 585 minutes spent on television, internet etc. a week? "Do this in memory of me" (1 Co 11:24) – the Eucharist cost the Lord his life! "This is my body, for you" – love for us without limit, up to death, that is what Jesus made of his life. "The Church lives from the Eucharist", wrote the Blessed Pope John Paul II. The Eucharist IS communion with Christ. Communion with Christ is the basis for communion with one another. The Eucharistic association is an ecclesial association. Taking part in the Eucharist is in no way comparable with a club meeting. It is neither a happening nor an event. Celebrating the Eucharist is to associate with the Lord Himself.

Every Christian is called to become an image of Christ. Our daily troubles do not disappear with the celebration of the Eucharist, but we receive a solid foundation to face all these worries with hope: In God's presence we find the strength to tackle our problems. The coming days of Lent are meant to assist our preparation for Easter, to rediscover the gift of the Eucharist for us and for our faith, to come to a deeper appreciation so that we may walk our way through the times with renewed courage and a happy heart, in faith, hope and charity and in constant communion with the living Lord.

I wish you all a time of rich blessing and grace in the preparation for the feast of Easter.
