The Prodigal Father

Zeffirelli's film "Jesus of Nazareth" situates the parable of the "prodigal son" into an interesting context. Jesus has just called into his inner circle an unlikely candidate: Mathew, the tax-collector who wants to thank him with a dinner-invitation to his house. The disciples refuse to enter the home of this public sinner. Jesus walks calmly into the company of half-drunken revelers and prostitutes, and then offers them a story. Turning to Matthew he tells him the story of the younger son. Matthew realizes that Jesus' story is his life-story and breaks into tears. Then Jesus turns to his disciples at the door and tells them about the elder son who refuses to enter the feast. Peter understands the point, walks in and embraces Matthew. Now a true celebration of reconciliation can begin.

Where do I find myself in Jesus' story? in the younger son? the elder son? Maybe we are a bit of both. We tend to be hedonists, pleasure-seekers. Maybe on a personal level, but surely in our consumer culture we resemble the first son. We squander God's gifts of creation, the limited resources of our planet, in a careless, wasteful lifestyle at the expense of future generations and seem to end up lonely, empty-handed, empty-hearted, burned out. We may also decide to stay in the father's house, yet become bitter, "hardened in virtue", joyless and lifeless, and do our duty grudgingly without love.

But at the center of the story are not the sons, but the father. His children disappoint him no end and none of them understands him. One runs away, the other stays resentfully. Yet, God does not turn away in disgust. God leaves us free to go our own ways, while His heart keeps longing for us. God knows no greater joy than seeing his children come home to stay with Him.
