# May 19, 2013 Pentecost Sunday

## Acts 2:1-11 • Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-31, 34 • 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7,12-13• John 20:19-23

### Jesus is with us in his word and in sacred signs

Effective communication combines word and sign. A mother says to her child: "You are wonderful" and then hugs and kisses the child. A lover says: "I love you" and offers a bunch of red roses. Commercial posters always combine both a catchy text and a cool picture.

Jesus, too, most of the time started his ministry with an extraordinary sign and then explained its true meaning. He shocks Peter with a miracles catch of fish and then sends him into the world to "catch" people into the net of his Church. He heals a physical defect and points to the sickness of the soul. ("Your sins are forgiven!") He breaks and shares bread and explains that the broken and shared bread is really are himself as he gives his life to all.

The Eucharistic celebration follow the same pattern: Jesus gives us his Word as "a light for our path" and then gives us a sign of his self-giving in the breaking of the break. The word without the sacramental sign lacks life; the sign without an explanation has no meaning.

Word and sacrament, these two intimately connected modes of communication were torn apart during the Reformation. Catholics had forgotten the bible and given the sacraments an almost magic quality. In reaction the reformation throw out most sacraments and at times even destroyed all images. The Second Vatican Council brought together what belongs together. Catholics have rediscovered the riches of the bible, Protestants the power of sacraments and signs.

As Catholics we have to ask ourselves what place the Word of God has in our lives. When did I last open my Bible? Bible study can help us to understand the text better. But more important is the prayerful reading of God's word (lectio divina) with the conviction that God has through his word a message for me. I read the words slowly, let them touch me and ask myself: What does God want to tell me for my life today?
