## The "discipline" that comes from God breaks open our narrow-mindedness

Most of us dread to hear the word "discipline." Discipline is linked with the image of restriction and loosing freedom. Even if discipline comes from God, we still cringe at its mention. "When the Lord punishes you, don't make light of it, and when he corrects you, don't be discouraged. The Lord corrects the people he loves and disciplines those he calls his own" (Hebr 12:5-7, 11-13). St. Theresa of Avila writes in one of her prayers: "God, if this is how you treat your friends, it's no wonder you have so many enemies."

God's biblical discipline is a unique process: contrary to most human conditioning, it prepares us to habitually open up, to overcome the limits which restrict most people's thoughts and behavior. Isaiah (Isaiah 66:18-21) has one major task: he is to get the Israelites who had been Babylonian captives to return to the Promised Land. The Persians had conquered the Babylonians, and permitted the Israelite exiles to go back home. But Jerusalem was just a heap of ruins and the majority of the Israelites decided to stay in Babylon where they knew what to expect. However, if Israel's people are interested in playing a role in God's plan for the whole world, they have an obligation to return and rebuild Jerusalem. This is a sign for those who are "disciplined" and formed by Yahweh: they must break through their narrow-mindedness and follow a God who includes non-Jews in his plans. Their actions will determine whether some of the Gentiles will become followers of Yahweh or remain devotees of other gods.

**Luke**'s Jesus is working from the same frame of mind: He encourages his followers to "enter through the narrow gate" (Luke 13:22-30). "People will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at the table in the kingdom of God." However, many of those who took salvation for granted will be shocked that they haven't been invited to the big event. Perhaps the best way to discipline ourselves according to God's method is to constantly remind ourselves of Jesus' statement: "Behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last" (Luke 13 30). "The ones who are now least important will be the most important, and those who are now most important will be least important."
