All our decisions should result from our reflection on what it means to share the faith of Jesus

Paul's letter to Philemon conveys a message which is central to being a follower of Jesus. Philemon is one of Paul's wealthy converts; Onesimus is Philemon's runaway slave who asks Paul to let him be his personal servant.

What would we do today? We would free this helpless individual. However, Christian morality has not yet evolved to this point during Paul's ministry. Paul insists for slave owners to treat their slaves humanely but it takes another 1,700 years for slavery to be abolished. Paul's notion of "freedom" lays the foundation for abolition and enables Christians to break many restrictions which enslaved them to customs, traditions, and practices. "The corruptible body burdens the soul and the earthen shelter weighs down the mind that has many concerns" (Wisdom 9:13-18b). In other words, our human condition provides us occasions for freedom. Luke's Jesus also promises his followers that, by imitating him, they'll be free to make lifechanging decisions (Luke 14:25-33) and assume deliberate choices to follow him and accept the consequences of carrying their daily cross.

We can appreciate Paul's solution to the Onesimus dilemma. Paul demands for both Philemon and Onesimus to make a mutual decision. The runaway slave should deliver Paul's letter requesting for Philemon to release Onesimus. But Onesimus runs a risk: if he confronts Philemon, will Philemon freely hand him over to Paul? We presume Philemon does – otherwise the letter would not have been saved. For Christians, such freeing actions do not happen by accident. They are the result of deep reflection on their Christian faith. I encourage you to reflect on what it means for you to share the faith of Jesus and to be a friend of Jesus.
