The Pharisee and the tax collector

A well-known scene: the Pharisee and a tax collector are praying, both are in search for a relation with God. The Pharisee is self-confident and upright – and addresses God. He is aware and proud of everything he does for God. He really tries to lead a life that pleases God: the doctrine and the rules of the religious law are important for him. His fasting and charity are signs of this holy life. He thanks God for not being like many others. By distinguishing himself from others, he finds his uniqueness before God and in an intimate relation with God.

The tax collector sees himself differently: he knows about his weaknesses and his failings. He is depressed, weighed down by his human misery. His profession has the reputation to be a means for corruption. Therefore he does not dare to approach God, he humbles himself and admits that he is a sinner.

Isn't the Pharisee a model for us in many regards? We also dare to approach God in an upright way – we are no underage children. God created us in his image, we are human beings with our own responsibility, our talents and capacities, and we can be proud of this. We can show God everything we have achieved in our lives by these talents.

The tax collector can also be our model. In spite of the talents we have, there is so much we cannot achieve, where we fail, where we are insufficient, inadequate and incapable. It is difficult to admit our failures to ourselves, others, or to God. But our trust in God's mercy and love enables us to deal with ourselves in a candid and honest way. This is what the tax collector did. He felt that God would not dismiss him because of his mistakes and weaknesses. He felt that God would give him the chance for a new beginning.

The tax collector is also a model for us – just as the Pharisee. We should look more for the things we have in common than for the things that separate us. Sometimes we are the Pharisee, sometimes the tax collector. And what is true for us as individuals is also true for religions, cultures and nations.
