#### Saint John Paul II

Today, on 27 April 2014, John Paul II will be canonized alongside John XXIII.

Karol Józef Wojtyła, known as John Paul II, was born in the Polish town of Wadowice on May 18, 1920. His university studies were interrupted by the Nazi occupation and he worked in a quarry and a chemical factory. In 1942, he began his studies at the clandestine seminary of Kraków and was ordained to the priesthood in 1946. He finished his doctorate in theology in Rome in 1948 and became vicar in Kraków and chaplain to university students. From 1951 he again took up studies in philosophy and theology and became professor of moral theology and social ethics in Kraków and Lublin. After becoming bishop, archbishop and cardinal, he was elected pope at the Conclave of 16 October 1978. His pontificate, one of the longest in the history of the Church, lasted nearly 27 years.

He made almost 250 pastoral visits, many of them abroad, and had more meetings than any of his predecessors with the People of God and the leaders of nations. More than 17 million pilgrims participated in the General Audiences, alone 8 million during the Great Jubilee of the Year 2000. He held nearly 1000 official visits, audiences and meetings with Heads of State and Prime Ministers.

He established the World Youth Days (WYD) and the World Meetings of Families. With the Year of the Redemption, the Marian Year and the Year of the Eucharist, he promoted the spiritual renewal of the Church. He beatified 1,340 people and canonized 483 saints, more than his predecessors during five centuries. A key goal of his papacy was to transform and reposition the Catholic Church. He wanted "to place his Church at the heart of a new religious alliance to bring together Jews, Muslims and Christians". His most important Documents include many Encyclicals, Apostolic Exhortations, Apostolic Constitutions, Apostolic Letters and five books.

The first miracle attributed to Saint John Paul II, which led to his beatification, was the healing of a French nun from Parkinson's disease in 2005. Sister Marie Simon-Pierre had said that her illness suddenly vanished when her order started praying on her behalf, and she wrote down Pope John Paul II's name on a piece of paper. A second miracle involved a Costa Rican woman who was cured of a cerebral aneurysm the very day of John Paul II's beatification.

In 2009, John Paul II was proclaimed Venerable by Pope Benedict XVI and was beatified on 1 May 2011 after the first miracle was attributed to him. The second miracle was confirmed by Pope Francis in 2013. His feast day is celebrated on 22 October, the anniversary of his papal inauguration in 1978.
