King Solomon's special request to God

King Solomon's wisdom is proverbial. He was the son of David and became king although he was not the elder son. His mother and the prophet Nathan were intrigued for Solomon to be made king. According to the bible, he reigned for forty years – "*for a very long time, for a generation*". Solomon's reign was peaceful; he had the first temple built in Jerusalem and modernized the kingdom. After his death the kingdom split in two.

Solomon was mainly concerned with his people. "Give your servant an understanding heart to judge, to govern your people and to distinguish right from wrong. – Please make me wise and teach me the difference between right and wrong. Then I will know how to rule your people. If you don't, there is no way I could rule this great nation of yours". (1 Kings 3:9). Not asking for power or material goods is typical for a wise person. God answers: "Ask something of me and I will give it to you". Solomon does not ask anything for himself, instead he asks for something which he can use to serve others. Would we also do the same if asked?

Do we see personalities like Solomon today in the US, Europe, or elsewhere? Do we see politicians and people who put the common good before self-interests and are interested in "*the big project of a just society*"? We must include our Church and its leaders. Power, special interests and lobbying by different groups all play an important role. Do we still see the "*pearl*" the gospel presents us, the "*treasure from the field*"? Or is the pearl hidden behind ecclesial lobbies and particular interests within the Church?

Am I unselfish enough to desire gifts or talents that can be put at the service of others? Paul says in the letter to the Romans: "God has always known who his chosen ones would be. He had decided to let them become like his own Son, so that his Son would be the first of many children." (Rom 8:29) What is my relationship to God? Do I try to become a brother or a sister to others? And finally: Where do I invest my energies? Do I look for the *treasure in the field* or do I resign myself to be "thrown away with the bad fish" as the gospel says (Mt 13:48)?
