Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

Acts 1:1-11; Psalm 46; Ephesians 4:1-13; Mark 16:15-20

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells us of the Ascension of Jesus when he was taken up into heaven in the sight of his followers. The text begins with Luke reminding Theophilus about Jesus Christ and his work and how he died and rose from the dead. He recounts how he met with his followers for forty days after this and how, as he was speaking to them, he was taken up to heaven and not seen by them again. Those who were with him at that moment continued to look into heaven because they had not realised what had actually taken place and had to be brought back to reality by two angels who told them that the Lord had returned to heaven. But before departing from them the Lord told them that they would receive the Holy Spirit and that this would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world.

St Paul, in the second reading, implores us to live a life which is worthy of our vocation. We all have the common vocation of being God's sons and daughters and living as Christians, but the vocation manifests itself in different ways according to the skills each of us has. It is in the diversity of each person that the Body of Christ gains its unity and its strength, and the bond between each person is the Holy Spirit – the gift of Jesus to his people.

In the gospel from St Mark, we read the account of the ascension of Jesus and before he leaves them we see Jesus sending the Eleven out into the world to preach in his name. There is a brief synopsis of what they will be able to accomplish – heal the sick, speak in tongues, be unharmed by poison, cast out devils – and all because they believe in Jesus and in his message and have him working in and through them. As the successors to the disciples we too are commissioned to go out and to preach the word of God to all peoples and to let them see and feel his compassion and his love in their midst.
