Solemnity of the Corpus Christi

Today we celebrate the great solemnity of Corpus Christi – the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ – which has the Last Supper on Holy Thursday night as its backdrop and origin. We celebrate it today in thanksgiving for the great gift we receive through the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ freely given for us. In today's solemnity we celebrate in a very special way the fact that the Lord is really, truly and substantially present under the appearance of bread and wine. This Sacred Host, this True Presence is reserved in the tabernacles in our churches and chapels and strengthens us and the Church along the path to salvation. Jesus made a new and everlasting covenant with us which brings eternal life to all who believe in him and this covenant was sealed in his blood on the Cross. Traditionally, this day was marked by processions with the Blessed Sacrament carried through towns and villages whose streets and neighbourhoods were cleaned up and decorated for the occasion. The solemnity marks one of the great mysteries of our faith and with it one of the great gifts which God has given to his Church.

In the first reading from the Book of Exodus, Moses has returned to the people and tells them God's commandments and his judgements. The people assent to all of this and the rituals for sealing the covenant between them and God are carried out. Part of that was the sprinkling of some of the blood on the altar (which represented God) and the sprinkling of the remaining blood on the people which showed their close union with God and their willingness to be faithful to the covenant or contract they had just agreed. In the second reading from the letter to the Hebrews, the author speaks about the blood of Jesus Christ which not only brings eternal life but also purifies the people. The blood of bulls and calves of the Old Testament only brought an outward purification, whereas the blood of Jesus Christ brings inner purification to the believer and allows them to become better servants or faithful disciples for God.

The gospel from St Mark recounts the preparations in the lead-up to the Last Supper of the Lord. During that meal, Jesus instituted the Eucharist by giving the bread and wine as his body and blood to his disciples. At the end of the meal the group moved to the Mount of Olives as the Lord prepared to give his life, to shed his blood for his people that they may have life. Jesus is really, truly and substantially present in the bread and wine after the consecration and these remain forever his Body and Blood which we receive at Mass or return to adore in the Eucharistic presence in the tabernacle. There is no greater possession in the world than the Body and Blood of Christ but it is worthless to us if we do not believe and live the life to which it calls us.
