### Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.

Our first reading comes from the last chapter of the Book of Exodus as the people have now returned to the Promised Land. In the passage, Joshua – Moses' successor as leader – calls the people together at Shechem and asks them whom they wish to serve: the true God or the gods of the local peoples. They opt for the true God who led them from Egypt, from slavery, and who preserved them all along their long journey. The people affirm that they will not desert the Lord.

Our gospel passage comes from the closing section of the Bread of Life discourse from the sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel. In the preceding passages Jesus had told the people that he was the bread of life; that only those who ate of his flesh could have eternal life; and that he was the Son of Man, the one sent by the Father. Many of those who had listened to him were not happy at these words, particularly the idea of eating his flesh, and so they left him and refused to listen to him again. It is possible that some of those who left were from the multitude who had come to hear him at the beginning of the discourse, but the passage makes it clear that some of the disciples also left, showing how difficult the teaching was even for those who had been committed to him. Jesus turns to the Twelve, his inner circle, and asks them if they too want to leave. On behalf of the group, St. Peter says that they will stay with Jesus because only he has the message of eternal life. We too must ask ourselves whether or not we believe in Christ's message and whether or not we follow the Lord as the people in the first reading swore to do. If we truly believe in the words Jesus spoke, then that should be evident in the way in which we treat others and in our attendance at the Eucharist.

At the time that the letter to the Ephesians was being written there was criticism being levelled against Christians that their ideas of equality were causing a breakdown in society. Today's passage was an attempt at correcting that charge and uses structures which were commonly found in Roman society. It does appear very patriarchal, which is to be expected, as it is a product of the time. However, there is still a new standard being set before the people here and that is the love of Christ as the foundation stone of our relationships in which the Christian is to act as Christ would act. That means that the relationships within a family must become much deeper and more open to each other and, while the man was the traditional head of the household, now he must act from a Christ-like perspective which puts the needs and wants of others in the household before his own. The family unit, the bond between husband and wife, is an imitation of the bond between Christ and his people and which is built on the foundation of love.
