# **Reflection on the Twenty-Second Sunday Reading**

In the first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy, we see that Moses has given the people the Ten Commandments and the various other Laws and now he encourages the people to be faithful to them. In this they are not to alter the laws or add to them but are to live them as the Lord gave and intended them, to see the wisdom that they contain. By the people being faithful to these instructions, non-believers will come to see that there is indeed a God to be followed – a God who is close to his people.

Today we return to St. Mark's Gospel and which will take us to the end of the liturgical year. In today's passage, we see Jesus admonishing the Pharisees and scribes for over-emphasizing the letter of the Law and not adhering at all to the spirit of the Law. Some of the laws regarding washing were originally intended for the priestly class but through the centuries some of the elders had extended them to all of the people, placing the emphasis on the action rather than on the reason for the action. Jesus was not saying that washing was bad but that the emphasis was wrong, and not in a way that was good for the people. The Lord's words about the food people ate didn't necessarily dismiss the idea of a kosher diet but again highlighted an incorrect interpretation and application of the law: the evil thoughts and actions of the people come from within themselves, from within their hearts, rather than through their food. These readings today remind us that the Commandments and the Law of God are there not to make life difficult but to give life, to improve the quality of life which we already have. Only by keeping the Commandments of God as he intended them can we grow and inherit eternal life.

Our second reading for the next five weeks comes from the letter attributed to St. James, leader of the Mother Church in Jerusalem. In today's passage, the reader is reminded that all the gifts they receive come from above and all are good. They come from God the Father who, unlike the sun in the sky or the light it emits, never changes but is always present and life giving. So too, the message of God is never changing but always the same and calls for a response. The people are to accept the word given them at baptism, to take it to heart, to live it out in their lives. As elsewhere in the letter, the author gives an image of faith in action: faith cannot simply be a matter of words but of action too.
