Homily on the Twenty Seventh Sunday

The readings for today speak of the importance of the unity of the family of God and of the permanence of marriage. The first reading comes from the Book of Genesis and sees the creation of woman as a suitable helpmate companion for the man. The man had been made from the earth but the woman is made from the man himself and so there is a very strong connection between them and there is also a certain equality between them. The passage ends with the idea of marriage which is between man and woman: they leave their respective families and come together to form their own.

In the gospel for today we have Jesus' teaching on divorce and remarriage. In the Mosaic Law, there was permission given for a man to dismiss his wife from his house if there was something about her which displeased him, while Roman law allowed the woman to initiate the divorce proceedings. The question was not about reasons for divorce but about the fact of divorce and the Lord made it clear that it was not in God's plan. It is our belief that Jesus is the Son of the Father and so is God and therefore he knows the very mind of God and so what he says is truth. In this instance, the Lord doesn't condemn those who have divorced or remarried but he is saying, clearly, that it is not what God wants for his people. The message of Jesus Christ is Good News and is not meant to oppress the faithful, but it does raise the bar for us and encourage us towards a better way of living, even if at times that is a test for us. Though this is not easy for everyone to live, it is something towards which the world must strive if is to remain faithful to the teaching of Christ and the will of the Father. It is interesting that many today use Jesus as a reason for challenging the way things are done, and yet they don't want to acknowledge this particular challenge to the way things were and are now done - divorce had been the accepted norm for centuries but the Lord said it was wrong. In the second part of the text, people are bringing their children to Jesus because they believe in him and so seek his blessing on their children. At the time, children had no status and were powerless and so the disciples move them on as an irrelevance. Jesus calls them to him and reminds the disciples that the Kingdom is a gift offered to all peoples and must be accepted as a gift. Children receive everything as a gift and their joyful acceptance is the attitude that all people should have to the Kingdom and the invitation to dwell there.

For the remainder of this liturgical year our second reading comes from the Letter to the Hebrews which is written to an unknown group and is attributed to St Paul, though it is accepted that he did not actually write the letter. Our passages will focus very much on the priesthood and sacrifice of Jesus. In today's passage, the author is speaking of Jesus and says that he gave up his kingship and his power to become a lowly servant and then underwent death. This was done to bring the faithful to the Kingdom. In so doing he has been crowned with splendour and glory, while also purifying and sanctifying those who believe in him. Those purified are humans just as he was and so we are his brothers and sisters, we are called
